Saving wonderful water in the bathroom

Top tip: fix your leaky loo

A leaking toilet wastes up to 400 litres of clean drinking water on average every day. It's like having a couple of extra people using water in your home!

Between 5 and 8% of toilets are leaking, mostly dual flush toilets. If you can hear a flow

of water when the toilet hasn't been flushed or can see a slight but constant trickle at the back of the toilet pan, you probably have a leaky loo.
