Can I use a Self-Lay Provider for my development?

Developers can choose to have certain water mains and service connections works carried out by an accredited Self-Lay Provider (this is known as Contestable work). You can find an accredited Self-Lay Provider on the Lloyd Register.

There are some works that only we can complete (known as Non-Contestable work). We've summarised these activities below. You can also view our detailed Contestability Matrix in our Annual Contestability Summary



Work that a Self-Lay Provider can undertake (Contestable)

1. Mains scheme designs

2. Laying new mains

 Includes pressure testing, chlorinating, and sampling.

3. In-Line connections (connecting pipework back to back)

- After pressure tests, sample tests, and approval.
- Connecting new mains pipework to a live main without cutting into the existing main.

4. Self-inspection of supply pipes and communication pipes

 Must be certified under schemes like WIAPS, A Plus, or Watermark.

5. Laying of service pipes

- Up to 90mm.
- 6. Service connections for new infill properties* or development sites
 - Up to 90mm for PE and barrier pipe mains.
- 7. Installation of meters for new infill properties or development sites
 - Up to 90mm.

* "Infill properties" are generally considered as new buildings built on vacant or underused land within existing urban areas.

X Work that can only be undertaken by Severn Trent (Non-Contestable)

1. Connections of most mains onto the existing network

- Often referred to as 'source of water' (SOW) connection.
- 2. Service connections greater than 90mm.
- 3. Valve operations on the live network that could affect existing supplies.
- 4. Disconnections of existing service connections or branch connections on the live network
