# **Discover Foremark Water**

Immerse yourself in the rolling Derbyshire countryside, in the heart of the National Forest. Get active with plenty of waymarked trails to explore, wander through the woodlands at Carvers Rocks or find a quiet spot and enjoy a picnic. Keep an eye open for wildlife – over 200 species of birds have been spotted here.

### Wren Trail • • • • Distance: 2.5km (1.5 mi)

Take an easy stroll down the bridleway and through Scaddows Oaks Community Woodland before branching off to join the main woodland walk alongside the reservoir. Here you might spot Great Crested Grebe fishing or performing their elaborate courtship display.

**Woodland Trail** • • • • • **Distance:** 2.25km (1.4 mi)

This non-circular walk takes you straight along the reservoir edge to Carvers Rocks Nature Reserve, which is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). Be prepared for some steps, styles and steep slopes. You will be rewarded with the purple carpet of blooming heather on one of Derbyshire's last patches of lowland heath.

### Badger Trail ● ● ● ● Distance: 5.25km (3.25 mi)

The longest circular walk, with some steps, gates and steep slopes to negotiate. This trail gives you the best of everything – a pleasant bridleway walk into Carvers Rocks Nature Reserve, shaded woodland studded with bluebells in spring, and the reservoir shoreline where you can count the ducks.

#### Butterfly Trail ● ● ● ● Distance: 1.25km (0.75 mi)

**Distance:** 1.25km (0.75 m)

This easy going, level route lets you explore the main areas of the site, including a stretch of the foreshore and a section of bridleway. Stop at the playground for little visitors to let off steam.

The paths are multi-purpose – please share with care.

Please keep dogs on leads for their own safety and to avoid disturbance to sheep, lambs and other wildlife.

Ask at the kiosk for children's seasonal trails and orienteering maps.
